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This Transfer Pathway represents one example of how to complete the BCJ program at Tiffin University. Students should work closely with advisors at both institutions to discuss options. Students should work with a Tiffin University advisor to identify a (minor or a second major/etc.). A Tiffin University advisor can also assist students with developing a graduation plan for full- or part-time study. A grade of "C" or better, or a "Pass" in a Pass/Fail transcripted course must be achieved to receive transfer credit.

All students must complete:

- A minimum of 121 semester hours (combination of courses at community college and TU) completed.
- A minimum of 48 semester hours completed at a 4-year institution with 30 of these semester hours being completed with Tiffin University.
