TU's Bachelor of Arts in Workplace Leadership, is a transfer-friendly degree-completion program, designed to build 21st-century skills and help you become a leader at work.

#### YOUR WORKPLACE LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Workplaces can be dynamic, fast-paced and ever-changing. A TU degree in workplace leadership will help you develop crucial leadership skills in the areas of critical thinking, problem-solving and multimodal communication, all through the lens of multiple cultural perspectives.

The program, which is centered around TU's new and innovative *Dragon Core Curriculum* and commitment to *Celebrating Cultural Uniqueness*, is extremely transfer friendly. Up to 90 hours of transfer credit may be applied toward the program, with as few as 31 credits of coursework required for completion at TU. A minimum of 48 hours of transfer credit is required to enroll in this program.

## PRACTICAL EDUCATION

The program includes classes that teach the key skills that workplace leaders need to develop for a successful career: interpersonal communication, strategic business planning, delegation, cultural intelligence, team building, leadership development and change management. The program also features multidisciplinary coursework designed to build skills and competencies around communication, problem solving and leadership, particularly in diverse environments.

A seven-course leadership sequence will help you hone your skills in appropriate and effective communication. These leadership skills allow you to analyze information about the diverse human condition, identify assumptions and evidence and implement solutions to improve functionality in a diverse global environment.

### Theory and Application of Leadership (SCS440)

This interactive course examines theories and approaches to leadership. This course provides historical analysis of leaders and the evolution of leadership theory as well as gender and cultural approach to the topic. Students will gain an understanding of the leadership process and its elements, leaders, followers and contexts. The course will review the scholarship and research of leadership and provide a synthesis of the contemporary leadership models.
